

All the verses in the ESV Bible with the words “anger” or “angry” in them.

- Gen 4:5 but for Cain and his offering he had no regard. So Cain was very **angry**, and his face fell.
- Gen 4:6 The Lord said to Cain, “Why are you **angry**, and why has your face fallen?”
- Gen 18:30 Then he said, “Oh let not the Lord be **angry**, and I will speak. Suppose thirty are found there.” He answered, “I will not do it, if I find thirty there.”
- Gen 18:32 Then he said, “Oh let not the Lord be **angry**, and I will speak again but this once. Suppose ten are found there.” He answered, “For the sake of ten I will not destroy it.”
- Gen 27:45 until your brother’s **anger** turns away from you, and he forgets what you have done to him. Then I will send and bring you from there. Why should I be bereft of you both in one day?”
- Gen 30:2 Jacob’s **anger** was kindled against Rachel, and he said, “Am I in the place of God, who has withheld from you the fruit of the womb?”
- Gen 31:35 And she said to her father, “Let not my lord be **angry** that I cannot rise before you, for the way of women is upon me.” So he searched but did not find the household gods.
- Gen 31:36 Then Jacob became **angry** and berated Laban. Jacob said to Laban, “What is my offense? What is my sin, that you have hotly pursued me?”
- Gen 34:7 The sons of Jacob had come in from the field as soon as they heard of it, and the men were indignant and very **angry**, because he had done an outrageous thing in Israel by lying with Jacob’s daughter, for such a thing must not be done.
- Gen 39:19 As soon as his master heard the words that his wife spoke to him, “This is the way your servant treated me,” his **anger** was kindled.
- Gen 40:2 And Pharaoh was **angry** with his two officers, the chief cupbearer and the chief baker,
- Gen 41:10 When Pharaoh was **angry** with his servants and put me and the chief baker in custody in the house of the captain of the guard,
- Gen 44:18 Then Judah went up to him and said, “Oh, my lord, please let your servant speak a word in my lord’s ears, and let not your **anger** burn against your servant, for you are like Pharaoh himself.
- Gen 45:5 And now do not be distressed or **angry** with yourselves because you sold me here, for God sent me before you to preserve life.
- Gen 49:6 Let my soul come not into their council; O my glory, be not joined to their company. For in their **anger** they killed men, and in their willfulness they hamstrung oxen.

- Gen 49:7 Cursed be their **anger**, for it is fierce, and their wrath, for it is cruel! I will divide them in Jacob and scatter them in Israel.
- Exod 4:14 Then the **anger** of the Lord was kindled against Moses and he said, "Is there not Aaron, your brother, the Levite? I know that he can speak well. Behold, he is coming out to meet you, and when he sees you, he will be glad in his heart.
- Exod 11:8 And all these your servants shall come down to me and bow down to me, saying, 'Get out, you and all the people who follow you.' And after that I will go out." And he went out from Pharaoh in hot **anger**.
- Exod 16:20 But they did not listen to Moses. Some left part of it till the morning, and it bred worms and stank. And Moses was **angry** with them.
- Exod 32:12 Why should the Egyptians say, 'With evil intent did he bring them out, to kill them in the mountains and to consume them from the face of the earth'? Turn from your burning **anger** and relent from this disaster against your people.
- Exod 32:19 And as soon as he came near the camp and saw the calf and the dancing, Moses' **anger** burned hot, and he threw the tablets out of his hands and broke them at the foot of the mountain.
- Exod 32:22 And Aaron said, "Let not the **anger** of my lord burn hot. You know the people, that they are set on evil.
- Exod 34:6 The Lord passed before him and proclaimed, "The Lord, the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to **anger**, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness,
- Lev 10:16 Now Moses diligently inquired about the goat of the sin offering, and behold, it was burned up! And he was **angry** with Eleazar and Ithamar, the surviving sons of Aaron, saying,
- Num 11:1 And the people complained in the hearing of the Lord about their misfortunes, and when the Lord heard it, his **anger** was kindled, and the fire of the Lord burned among them and consumed some outlying parts of the camp.
- Num 11:10 Moses heard the people weeping throughout their clans, everyone at the door of his tent. And the **anger** of the Lord blazed hotly, and Moses was displeased.
- Num 11:33 While the meat was yet between their teeth, before it was consumed, the **anger** of the Lord was kindled against the people, and the Lord struck down the people with a very great plague.
- Num 12:9 And the **anger** of the Lord was kindled against them, and he departed.
- Num 14:18 'The Lord is slow to **anger** and abounding in steadfast love, forgiving iniquity and transgression, but he will by no means clear the guilty, visiting

the iniquity of the fathers on the children, to the third and the fourth generation.'

- Num 16:15 And Moses was very **angry** and said to the Lord, "Do not respect their offering. I have not taken one donkey from them, and I have not harmed one of them."
- Num 16:22 And they fell on their faces and said, "O God, the God of the spirits of all flesh, shall one man sin, and will you be **angry** with all the congregation?"
- Num 22:22 But God's **anger** was kindled because he went, and the angel of the Lord took his stand in the way as his adversary. Now he was riding on the donkey, and his two servants were with him.
- Num 22:27 When the donkey saw the angel of the Lord, she lay down under Balaam. And Balaam's **anger** was kindled, and he struck the donkey with his staff.
- Num 24:10 And Balak's **anger** was kindled against Balaam, and he struck his hands together. And Balak said to Balaam, "I called you to curse my enemies, and behold, you have blessed them these three times.
- Num 25:3 So Israel yoked himself to Baal of Peor. And the **anger** of the Lord was kindled against Israel.
- Num 25:4 And the Lord said to Moses, "Take all the chiefs of the people and hang them in the sun before the Lord, that the fierce **anger** of the Lord may turn away from Israel."
- Num 31:14 And Moses was **angry** with the officers of the army, the commanders of thousands and the commanders of hundreds, who had come from service in the war.
- Num 32:10 And the Lord's **anger** was kindled on that day, and he swore, saying,
- Num 32:13 And the Lord's **anger** was kindled against Israel, and he made them wander in the wilderness forty years, until all the generation that had done evil in the sight of the Lord was gone.
- Num 32:14 And behold, you have risen in your fathers' place, a brood of sinful men, to increase still more the fierce **anger** of the Lord against Israel!
- Deut 1:34 "And the Lord heard your words and was **angered**, and he swore,
- Deut 1:37 Even with me the Lord was **angry** on your account and said, 'You also shall not go in there.
- Deut 3:26 But the Lord was **angry** with me because of you and would not listen to me. And the Lord said to me, 'Enough from you; do not speak to me of this matter again.
- Deut 4:21 Furthermore, the Lord was **angry** with me because of you, and he swore that I should not cross the Jordan, and that I should not enter the good land that the Lord your God is giving you for an inheritance.

- Deut 4:25 “When you father children and children’s children, and have grown old in the land, if you act corruptly by making a carved image in the form of anything, and by doing what is evil in the sight of the Lord your God, so as to provoke him to **anger**,
- Deut 6:15 for the Lord your God in your midst is a jealous God—lest the **anger** of the Lord your God be kindled against you, and he destroy you from off the face of the earth.
- Deut 7:4 for they would turn away your sons from following me, to serve other gods. Then the **anger** of the Lord would be kindled against you, and he would destroy you quickly.
- Deut 9:8 Even at Horeb you provoked the Lord to wrath, and the Lord was so **angry** with you that he was ready to destroy you.
- Deut 9:18 Then I lay prostrate before the Lord as before, forty days and forty nights. I neither ate bread nor drank water, because of all the sin that you had committed, in doing what was evil in the sight of the Lord to provoke him to **anger**.
- Deut 9:19 For I was afraid of the **anger** and hot displeasure that the Lord bore against you, so that he was ready to destroy you. But the Lord listened to me that time also.
- Deut 9:20 And the Lord was so **angry** with Aaron that he was ready to destroy him. And I prayed for Aaron also at the same time.
- Deut 11:17 then the **anger** of the Lord will be kindled against you, and he will shut up the heavens, so that there will be no rain, and the land will yield no fruit, and you will perish quickly off the good land that the Lord is giving you.
- Deut 13:17 None of the devoted things shall stick to your hand, that the Lord may turn from the fierceness of his **anger** and show you mercy and have compassion on you and multiply you, as he swore to your fathers,
- Deut 19:6 lest the avenger of blood in hot **anger** pursue the manslayer and overtake him, because the way is long, and strike him fatally, though the man did not deserve to die, since he had not hated his neighbor in the past.
- Deut 29:20 The Lord will not be willing to forgive him, but rather the **anger** of the Lord and his jealousy will smoke against that man, and the curses written in this book will settle upon him, and the Lord will blot out his name from under heaven.
- Deut 29:23 the whole land burned out with brimstone and salt, nothing sown and nothing growing, where no plant can sprout, an overthrow like that of Sodom and Gomorrah, Admah, and Zeboiim, which the Lord overthrew in his **anger** and wrath—
- Deut 29:24 all the nations will say, ‘Why has the Lord done thus to this land? What caused the heat of this great **anger**?’

- Deut 29:27 Therefore the **anger** of the Lord was kindled against this land, bringing upon it all the curses written in this book,
- Deut 29:28 and the Lord uprooted them from their land in **anger** and fury and great wrath, and cast them into another land, as they are this day.'
- Deut 31:17 Then my **anger** will be kindled against them in that day, and I will forsake them and hide my face from them, and they will be devoured. And many evils and troubles will come upon them, so that they will say in that day, 'Have not these evils come upon us because our God is not among us?'
- Deut 31:29 For I know that after my death you will surely act corruptly and turn aside from the way that I have commanded you. And in the days to come evil will befall you, because you will do what is evil in the sight of the Lord, provoking him to **anger** through the work of your hands."
- Deut 32:16 They stirred him to jealousy with strange gods; with abominations they provoked him to **anger**.
- Deut 32:21 They have made me jealous with what is no god; they have provoked me to **anger** with their idols. So I will make them jealous with those who are no people; I will provoke them to **anger** with a foolish nation.
- Deut 32:22 For a fire is kindled by my **anger**, and it burns to the depths of Sheol, devours the earth and its increase, and sets on fire the foundations of the mountains.
- Josh 7:1 But the people of Israel broke faith in regard to the devoted things, for Achan the son of Carmi, son of Zabdi, son of Zerah, of the tribe of Judah, took some of the devoted things. And the **anger** of the Lord burned against the people of Israel.
- Josh 7:26 And they raised over him a great heap of stones that remains to this day. Then the Lord turned from his burning **anger**. Therefore, to this day the name of that place is called the Valley of Achor.
- Josh 22:18 that you too must turn away this day from following the Lord? And if you too rebel against the Lord today then tomorrow he will be **angry** with the whole congregation of Israel.
- Josh 23:16 if you transgress the covenant of the Lord your God, which he commanded you, and go and serve other gods and bow down to them. Then the **anger** of the Lord will be kindled against you, and you shall perish quickly from off the good land that he has given to you."
- Judg 2:12 And they abandoned the Lord, the God of their fathers, who had brought them out of the land of Egypt. They went after other gods, from among the gods of the peoples who were around them, and bowed down to them. And they provoked the Lord to **anger**.
- Judg 2:14 So the **anger** of the Lord was kindled against Israel, and he gave them over to plunderers, who plundered them. And he sold them into the hand

of their surrounding enemies, so that they could no longer withstand their enemies.

- Judg 2:20 So the **anger** of the Lord was kindled against Israel, and he said, "Because this people has transgressed my covenant that I commanded their fathers and have not obeyed my voice,
- Judg 3:8 Therefore the **anger** of the Lord was kindled against Israel, and he sold them into the hand of Cushan-rishathaim king of Mesopotamia. And the people of Israel served Cushan-rishathaim eight years.
- Judg 6:39 Then Gideon said to God, "Let not your **anger** burn against me; let me speak just once more. Please let me test just once more with the fleece. Please let it be dry on the fleece only, and on all the ground let there be dew."
- Judg 8:3 God has given into your hands the princes of Midian, Oreb and Zeeb. What have I been able to do in comparison with you?" Then their **anger** against him subsided when he said this.
- Judg 9:30 When Zebul the ruler of the city heard the words of Gaal the son of Ebed, his **anger** was kindled.
- Judg 10:7 So the **anger** of the Lord was kindled against Israel, and he sold them into the hand of the Philistines and into the hand of the Ammonites,
- Judg 14:19 And the Spirit of the Lord rushed upon him, and he went down to Ashkelon and struck down thirty men of the town and took their spoil and gave the garments to those who had told the riddle. In hot **anger** he went back to his father's house.
- Judg 18:25 And the people of Dan said to him, "Do not let your voice be heard among us, lest **angry** fellows fall upon you, and you lose your life with the lives of your household."
- 1 Sam 11:6 And the Spirit of God rushed upon Saul when he heard these words, and his **anger** was greatly kindled.
- 1 Sam 15:11 "I regret that I have made Saul king, for he has turned back from following me and has not performed my commandments." And Samuel was **angry**, and he cried to the Lord all night.
- 1 Sam 17:28 Now Eliab his eldest brother heard when he spoke to the men. And Eliab's **anger** was kindled against David, and he said, "Why have you come down? And with whom have you left those few sheep in the wilderness? I know your presumption and the evil of your heart, for you have come down to see the battle."
- 1 Sam 18:8 And Saul was very **angry**, and this saying displeased him. He said, "They have ascribed to David ten thousands, and to me they have ascribed thousands, and what more can he have but the kingdom?"

- 1 Sam 20:7 If he says, 'Good!' it will be well with your servant, but if he is **angry**, then know that harm is determined by him.
- 1 Sam 20:30 Then Saul's **anger** was kindled against Jonathan, and he said to him, "You son of a perverse, rebellious woman, do I not know that you have chosen the son of Jesse to your own shame, and to the shame of your mother's nakedness?"
- 1 Sam 20:34 And Jonathan rose from the table in fierce **anger** and ate no food the second day of the month, for he was grieved for David, because his father had disgraced him.
- 1 Sam 29:4 But the commanders of the Philistines were **angry** with him. And the commanders of the Philistines said to him, "Send the man back, that he may return to the place to which you have assigned him. He shall not go down with us to battle, lest in the battle he become an adversary to us. For how could this fellow reconcile himself to his lord? Would it not be with the heads of the men here?"
- 2 Sam 3:8 Then Abner was very **angry** over the words of Ish-bosheth and said, "Am I a dog's head of Judah? To this day I keep showing steadfast love to the house of Saul your father, to his brothers, and to his friends, and have not given you into the hand of David. And yet you charge me today with a fault concerning a woman.
- 2 Sam 6:7 And the **anger** of the Lord was kindled against Uzzah, and God struck him down there because of his error, and he died there beside the ark of God.
- 2 Sam 6:8 And David was **angry** because the Lord had burst forth against Uzzah. And that place is called Perez-uzzah, to this day.
- 2 Sam 11:20 then, if the king's **anger** rises, and if he says to you, 'Why did you go so near the city to fight? Did you not know that they would shoot from the wall?'
- 2 Sam 12:5 Then David's **anger** was greatly kindled against the man, and he said to Nathan, "As the Lord lives, the man who has done this deserves to die,
- 2 Sam 13:21 When King David heard of all these things, he was very **angry**.
- 2 Sam 19:42 All the men of Judah answered the men of Israel, "Because the king is our close relative. Why then are you **angry** over this matter? Have we eaten at all at the king's expense? Or has he given us any gift?"
- 2 Sam 22:8 "Then the earth reeled and rocked; the foundations of the heavens trembled and quaked, because he was **angry**.
- 2 Sam 24:1 Again the **anger** of the Lord was kindled against Israel, and he incited David against them, saying, "Go, number Israel and Judah."
- 1 Kings 8:46 "If they sin against you—for there is no one who does not sin—and you are **angry** with them and give them to an enemy, so that they are carried away captive to the land of the enemy, far off or near,

- 1 Kings 11:9 And the Lord was **angry** with Solomon, because his heart had turned away from the Lord, the God of Israel, who had appeared to him twice
- 1 Kings 14:9 but you have done evil above all who were before you and have gone and made for yourself other gods and metal images, provoking me to **anger**, and have cast me behind your back,
- 1 Kings 14:15 the Lord will strike Israel as a reed is shaken in the water, and root up Israel out of this good land that he gave to their fathers and scatter them beyond the Euphrates, because they have made their Asherim, provoking the Lord to **anger**.
- 1 Kings 15:30 It was for the sins of Jeroboam that he sinned and that he made Israel to sin, and because of the **anger** to which he provoked the Lord, the God of Israel.
- 1 Kings 16:2 “Since I exalted you out of the dust and made you leader over my people Israel, and you have walked in the way of Jeroboam and have made my people Israel to sin, provoking me to **anger** with their sins,
- 1 Kings 16:7 Moreover, the word of the Lord came by the prophet Jehu the son of Hanani against Baasha and his house, both because of all the evil that he did in the sight of the Lord, provoking him to **anger** with the work of his hands, in being like the house of Jeroboam, and also because he destroyed it.
- 1 Kings 16:13 for all the sins of Baasha and the sins of Elah his son, which they sinned and which they made Israel to sin, provoking the Lord God of Israel to **anger** with their idols.
- 1 Kings 16:26 For he walked in all the way of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, and in the sins that he made Israel to sin, provoking the Lord, the God of Israel, to **anger** by their idols.
- 1 Kings 16:33 And Ahab made an Asherah. Ahab did more to provoke the Lord, the God of Israel, to **anger** than all the kings of Israel who were before him.
- 1 Kings 21:22 And I will make your house like the house of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, and like the house of Baasha the son of Ahijah, for the **anger** to which you have provoked me, and because you have made Israel to sin.
- 1 Kings 22:53 He served Baal and worshiped him and provoked the Lord, the God of Israel, to **anger** in every way that his father had done.
- 2 Kings 5:11 But Naaman was **angry** and went away, saying, “Behold, I thought that he would surely come out to me and stand and call upon the name of the Lord his God, and wave his hand over the place and cure the leper.
- 2 Kings 13:3 And the **anger** of the Lord was kindled against Israel, and he gave them continually into the hand of Hazael king of Syria and into the hand of Ben-hadad the son of Hazael.

- 2 Kings 13:19 Then the man of God was **angry** with him and said, “You should have struck five or six times; then you would have struck down Syria until you had made an end of it, but now you will strike down Syria only three times.”
- 2 Kings 17:11 and there they made offerings on all the high places, as the nations did whom the Lord carried away before them. And they did wicked things, provoking the Lord to **anger**,
- 2 Kings 17:17 And they burned their sons and their daughters as offerings and used divination and omens and sold themselves to do evil in the sight of the Lord, provoking him to **anger**.
- 2 Kings 17:18 Therefore the Lord was very **angry** with Israel and removed them out of his sight. None was left but the tribe of Judah only.
- 2 Kings 21:6 And he burned his son as an offering and used fortune-telling and omens and dealt with mediums and with necromancers. He did much evil in the sight of the Lord, provoking him to **anger**.
- 2 Kings 21:15 because they have done what is evil in my sight and have provoked me to **anger**, since the day their fathers came out of Egypt, even to this day.”
- 2 Kings 22:17 Because they have forsaken me and have made offerings to other gods, that they might provoke me to **anger** with all the work of their hands, therefore my wrath will be kindled against this place, and it will not be quenched.
- 2 Kings 23:19 And Josiah removed all the shrines also of the high places that were in the cities of Samaria, which kings of Israel had made, provoking the Lord to **anger**. He did to them according to all that he had done at Bethel.
- 2 Kings 23:26 Still the Lord did not turn from the burning of his great wrath, by which his **anger** was kindled against Judah, because of all the provocations with which Manasseh had provoked him.
- 2 Kings 24:20 For because of the **anger** of the Lord it came to the point in Jerusalem and Judah that he cast them out from his presence. And Zedekiah rebelled against the king of Babylon.
- 1 Chron 13:10 And the **anger** of the Lord was kindled against Uzzah, and he struck him down because he put out his hand to the ark, and he died there before God.
- 1 Chron 13:11 And David was **angry** because the Lord had broken out against Uzzah. And that place is called Perez-uzza to this day.
- 2 Chron 6:36 “If they sin against you—for there is no one who does not sin—and you are **angry** with them and give them to an enemy, so that they are carried away captive to a land far or near,

- 2 Chron 16:10 Then Asa was **angry** with the seer and put him in the stocks in prison, for he was in a rage with him because of this. And Asa inflicted cruelties upon some of the people at the same time.
- 2 Chron 21:16 And the Lord stirred up against Jehoram the **anger** of the Philistines and of the Arabians who are near the Ethiopians.
- 2 Chron 25:10 Then Amaziah discharged the army that had come to him from Ephraim to go home again. And they became very **angry** with Judah and returned home in fierce **anger**.
- 2 Chron 25:15 Therefore the Lord was **angry** with Amaziah and sent to him a prophet, who said to him, "Why have you sought the gods of a people who did not deliver their own people from your hand?"
- 2 Chron 26:19 Then Uzziah was **angry**. Now he had a censer in his hand to burn incense, and when he became **angry** with the priests, leprosy broke out on his forehead in the presence of the priests in the house of the Lord, by the altar of incense.
- 2 Chron 28:9 But a prophet of the Lord was there, whose name was Oded, and he went out to meet the army that came to Samaria and said to them, "Behold, because the Lord, the God of your fathers, was **angry** with Judah, he gave them into your hand, but you have killed them in a rage that has reached up to heaven.
- 2 Chron 28:25 In every city of Judah he made high places to make offerings to other gods, provoking to **anger** the Lord, the God of his fathers.
- 2 Chron 29:10 Now it is in my heart to make a covenant with the Lord, the God of Israel, in order that his fierce **anger** may turn away from us.
- 2 Chron 30:8 Do not now be stiff-necked as your fathers were, but yield yourselves to the Lord and come to his sanctuary, which he has consecrated forever, and serve the Lord your God, that his fierce **anger** may turn away from you.
- 2 Chron 33:6 And he burned his sons as an offering in the Valley of the Son of Hinnom, and used fortune-telling and omens and sorcery, and dealt with mediums and with necromancers. He did much evil in the sight of the Lord, provoking him to **anger**.
- 2 Chron 34:25 Because they have forsaken me and have made offerings to other gods, that they might provoke me to **anger** with all the works of their hands, therefore my wrath will be poured out on this place and will not be quenched.
- Ezra 5:12 But because our fathers had **angered** the God of heaven, he gave them into the hand of Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon, the Chaldean, who destroyed this house and carried away the people to Babylonia.

- Ezra 9:14 shall we break your commandments again and intermarry with the peoples who practice these abominations? Would you not be **angry** with us until you consumed us, so that there should be no remnant, nor any to escape?
- Neh 4:1 Now when Sanballat heard that we were building the wall, he was **angry** and greatly enraged, and he jeered at the Jews.
- Neh 4:5 Do not cover their guilt, and let not their sin be blotted out from your sight, for they have provoked you to **anger** in the presence of the builders.
- Neh 4:7 But when Sanballat and Tobiah and the Arabs and the Ammonites and the Ashdodites heard that the repairing of the walls of Jerusalem was going forward and that the breaches were beginning to be closed, they were very **angry**.
- Neh 5:6 I was very **angry** when I heard their outcry and these words.
- Neh 9:17 They refused to obey and were not mindful of the wonders that you performed among them, but they stiffened their neck and appointed a leader to return to their slavery in Egypt. But you are a God ready to forgive, gracious and merciful, slow to **anger** and abounding in steadfast love, and did not forsake them.
- Neh 13:8 And I was very **angry**, and I threw all the household furniture of Tobiah out of the chamber.
- Esther 1:12 But Queen Vashti refused to come at the king's command delivered by the eunuchs. At this the king became enraged, and his **anger** burned within him.
- Esther 2:1 After these things, when the **anger** of King Ahasuerus had abated, he remembered Vashti and what she had done and what had been decreed against her.
- Esther 2:21 In those days, as Mordecai was sitting at the king's gate, Bigthan and Teresh, two of the king's eunuchs, who guarded the threshold, became **angry** and sought to lay hands on King Ahasuerus.
- Job 4:9 By the breath of God they perish, and by the blast of his **anger** they are consumed.
- Job 9:5 he who removes mountains, and they know it not, when he overturns them in his **anger**,
- Job 9:13 "God will not turn back his **anger**; beneath him bowed the helpers of Rahab.
- Job 18:4 You who tear yourself in your **anger**, shall the earth be forsaken for you, or the rock be removed out of its place?
- Job 20:23 To fill his belly to the full, God will send his burning **anger** against him and rain it upon him into his body.
- Job 21:17 "How often is it that the lamp of the wicked is put out? That their calamity comes upon them? That God distributes pains in his **anger**?

- Job 32:2 Then Elihu the son of Barachel the Buzite, of the family of Ram, burned with **anger**. He burned with **anger** at Job because he justified himself rather than God.
- Job 32:3 He burned with **anger** also at Job's three friends because they had found no answer, although they had declared Job to be in the wrong.
- Job 32:5 And when Elihu saw that there was no answer in the mouth of these three men, he burned with **anger**.
- Job 35:15 And now, because his **anger** does not punish, and he does not take much note of transgression,
- Job 36:13 "The godless in heart cherish **anger**; they do not cry for help when he binds them.
- Job 40:11 Pour out the overflowings of your **anger**, and look on everyone who is proud and abase him.
- Job 42:7 After the Lord had spoken these words to Job, the Lord said to Eliphaz the Temanite: "My **anger** burns against you and against your two friends, for you have not spoken of me what is right, as my servant Job has.
- Ps 2:12 Kiss the Son, lest he be **angry**, and you perish in the way, for his wrath is quickly kindled. Blessed are all who take refuge in him.
- Ps 4:4 Be **angry**, and do not sin; ponder in your own hearts on your beds, and be silent. Selah
- Ps 6:1 To the choirmaster: with stringed instruments; according to The Sheminith. A Psalm of David. O Lord, rebuke me not in your **anger**, nor discipline me in your wrath.
- Ps 7:6 Arise, O Lord, in your **anger**; lift yourself up against the fury of my enemies; awake for me; you have appointed a judgment.
- Ps 18:7 Then the earth reeled and rocked; the foundations also of the mountains trembled and quaked, because he was **angry**.
- Ps 27:9 Hide not your face from me. Turn not your servant away in **anger**, O you who have been my help. Cast me not off; forsake me not, O God of my salvation!

- Ps 69:24 Pour out your indignation upon them, and let your burning **anger** overtake them.
- Ps 74:1 A Maskil of Asaph. O God, why do you cast us off forever? Why does your **anger** smoke against the sheep of your pasture?
- Ps 76:7 But you, you are to be feared! Who can stand before you when once your **anger** is roused?
- Ps 77:9 Has God forgotten to be gracious? Has he in **anger** shut up his compassion?" Selah
- Ps 78:21 Therefore, when the Lord heard, he was full of wrath; a fire was kindled against Jacob; his **anger** rose against Israel,

- Prov 14:29 Whoever is slow to **anger** has great understanding, but he who has a hasty temper exalts folly.
- Prov 15:1 A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up **anger**.
- Prov 15:18 A hot-tempered man stirs up strife, but he who is slow to **anger** quiets contention.
- Prov 16:32 Whoever is slow to **anger** is better than the mighty, and he who rules his spirit than he who takes a city.
- Prov 19:11 Good sense makes one slow to **anger**, and it is his glory to overlook an offense.
- Prov 20:2 The terror of a king is like the growling of a lion; whoever provokes him to **anger** forfeits his life.
- Prov 21:14 A gift in secret averts **anger**, and a concealed bribe, strong wrath.
- Prov 22:14 The mouth of forbidden women is a deep pit; he with whom the Lord is **angry** will fall into it.

- Isa 9:21 Manasseh devours Ephraim, and Ephraim devours Manasseh; together they are against Judah. For all this his **anger** has not turned away, and his hand is stretched out still.
- Isa 10:4 Nothing remains but to crouch among the prisoners or fall among the slain. For all this his **anger** has not turned away, and his hand is stretched out still.
- Isa 10:5 Ah, Assyria, the rod of my **anger**; the staff in their hands is my fury!
- Isa 10:25 For in a very little while my fury will come to an end, and my **anger** will be directed to their destruction.

- Isa 12:1 You will say in that day: "I will give thanks to you, O Lord, for though you were **angry** with me, your **anger** turned away, that you might comfort me.
- Isa 13:3 I myself have commanded my consecrated ones, and have summoned my mighty men to execute my **anger**, my proudly exulting ones.

- Isa 47:6 I was **angry** with my people; I profaned my heritage; I gave them into your hand; you showed them no mercy; on the aged you made your yoke exceedingly heavy.
- Isa 48:9 "For my name's sake I defer my **anger**, for the sake of my praise I restrain it for you, that I may not cut you off.
- Isa 54:8 In overflowing **anger** for a moment I hid my face from you, but with everlasting love I will have compassion on you," says the Lord, your Redeemer.
- Isa 54:9 "This is like the days of Noah to me: as I swore that the waters of Noah should no more go over the earth, so I have sworn that I will not be **angry** with you, and will not rebuke you.
- Isa 57:16 For I will not contend forever, nor will I always be **angry**; for the spirit would grow faint before me, and the breath of life that I made.
- Isa 57:17 Because of the iniquity of his unjust gain I was **angry**, I struck him; I hid my face and was **angry**, but he went on backsliding in the way of his own heart.
- Isa 63:3 "I have trodden the winepress alone, and from the peoples no one was with me; I trod them in my **anger** and trampled them in my wrath; their lifeblood spattered on my garments, and stained all my apparel.

- Isa 63:6 I trampled down the peoples in my **anger**; I made them drunk in my wrath, and I poured out their lifeblood on the earth.”
- Isa 64:5 You meet him who joyfully works righteousness, those who remember you in your ways. Behold, you were **angry**, and we sinned; in our sins we have been a long time, and shall we be saved?
- Isa 64:9 Be not so terribly **angry**, O Lord, and remember not iniquity forever. Behold, please look, we are all your people.
- Isa 66:15 “For behold, the Lord will come in fire, and his chariots like the whirlwind, to render his **anger** in fury, and his rebuke with flames of fire.
- Jer 2:35 you say, ‘I am innocent; surely his **anger** has turned from me.’ Behold, I will bring you to judgment for saying, ‘I have not sinned.’
- Jer 3:5 will he be **angry** forever, will he be indignant to the end?’ Behold, you have spoken, but you have done all the evil that you could.”
- Jer 3:12 Go, and proclaim these words toward the north, and say, “ ‘Return, faithless Israel, declares the Lord. I will not look on you in **anger**, for I am merciful, declares the Lord; I will not be **angry** forever.
- Jer 4:8 For this put on sackcloth, lament and wail, for the fierce **anger** of the Lord has not turned back from us.”
- Jer 4:26 I looked, and behold, the fruitful land was a desert, and all its cities were laid in ruins before the Lord, before his fierce **anger**.

- Jer 52:3 For because of the **anger** of the Lord things came to the point in Jerusalem and Judah that he cast them out from his presence. And Zedekiah rebelled against the king of Babylon.
- Lam 1:12 “Is it nothing to you, all you who pass by? Look and see if there is any sorrow like my sorrow, which was brought upon me, which the Lord inflicted on the day of his fierce **anger**.
- Lam 2:1 How the Lord in his **anger** has set the daughter of Zion under a cloud! He has cast down from heaven to earth the splendor of Israel; he has not remembered his footstool in the day of his **anger**.
- Lam 2:3 He has cut down in fierce **anger** all the might of Israel; he has withdrawn from them his right hand in the face of the enemy; he has burned like a flaming fire in Jacob, consuming all around.
- Lam 2:21 In the dust of the streets lie the young and the old; my young women and my young men have fallen by the sword; you have killed them in the day of your **anger**, slaughtering without pity.

- Lam 2:22 You summoned as if to a festival day my terrors on every side, and on the day of the **anger** of the Lord no one escaped or survived; those whom I held and raised my enemy destroyed.
- Lam 3:43 “You have wrapped yourself with **anger** and pursued us, killing without pity;
- Lam 3:66 You will pursue them in **anger** and destroy them from under your heavens, O Lord.”
- Lam 4:11 The Lord gave full vent to his wrath; he poured out his hot **anger**, and he kindled a fire in Zion that consumed its foundations.
- Lam 5:22 unless you have utterly rejected us, and you remain exceedingly **angry** with us.
- Ezek 5:13 “Thus shall my **anger** spend itself, and I will vent my fury upon them and satisfy myself. And they shall know that I am the Lord—that I have spoken in my jealousy—when I spend my fury upon them.
- Ezek 5:15 You shall be a reproach and a taunt, a warning and a horror, to the nations all around you, when I execute judgments on you in **anger** and fury, and with furious rebukes—I am the Lord; I have spoken—
- Ezek 7:3 Now the end is upon you, and I will send my **anger** upon you; I will judge you according to your ways, and I will punish you for all your abominations.
- Ezek 7:8 Now I will soon pour out my wrath upon you, and spend my **anger** against you, and judge you according to your ways, and I will punish you for all your abominations.
- Ezek 8:17 Then he said to me, “Have you seen this, O son of man? Is it too light a thing for the house of Judah to commit the abominations that they commit here, that they should fill the land with violence and provoke me still further to **anger**? Behold, they put the branch to their nose.

shall live; they profaned my Sabbaths. “Then I said I would pour out my wrath upon them and spend my **anger** against them in the wilderness.

- Ezek 22:20 As one gathers silver and bronze and iron and lead and tin into a furnace, to blow the fire on it in order to melt it, so I will gather you in my **anger** and in my wrath, and I will put you in and melt you.
- Ezek 25:14 And I will lay my vengeance upon Edom by the hand of my people Israel, and they shall do in Edom according to my **anger** and according to my wrath, and they shall know my vengeance, declares the Lord God.
- Ezek 35:11 therefore, as I live, declares the Lord God, I will deal with you according to the **anger** and envy that you showed because of your hatred against them. And I will make myself known among them, when I judge you.
- Ezek 38:18 But on that day, the day that Gog shall come against the land of Israel, declares the Lord God, my wrath will be roused in my **anger**.
- Ezek 43:8 by setting their threshold by my threshold and their doorposts beside my doorposts, with only a wall between me and them. They have defiled my holy name by their abominations that they have committed, so I have consumed them in my **anger**.
- Dan 2:12 Because of this the king was **angry** and very furious, and commanded that all the wise men of Babylon be destroyed.
- Dan 9:16 “O Lord, according to all your righteous acts, let your **anger** and your wrath turn away from your city Jerusalem, your holy hill, because for our sins, and for the iniquities of our fathers, Jerusalem and your people have become a byword among all who are around us.
- Dan 11:20 “Then shall arise in his place one who shall send an exactor of tribute for the glory of the kingdom. But within a few days he shall be broken, neither in **anger** nor in battle.
- Hos 7:6 For with hearts like an oven they approach their intrigue; all night their **anger** smolders; in the morning it blazes like a flaming fire.
- Hos 8:5 I have spurned your calf, O Samaria. My **anger** burns against them. How long will they be incapable of innocence?
- Hos 11:9 I will not execute my burning **anger**; I will not again destroy Ephraim; for I am God and not a man, the Holy One in your midst, and I will not come in wrath.
- Hos 13:11 I gave you a king in my **anger**, and I took him away in my wrath.
- Hos 14:4 I will heal their apostasy; I will love them freely, for my **anger** has turned from them.
- Joel 2:13 and rend your hearts and not your garments.” Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to **anger**, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster.

- Amos 1:11 Thus says the Lord: “For three transgressions of Edom, and for four, I will not revoke the punishment, because he pursued his brother with the sword and cast off all pity, and his **anger** tore perpetually, and he kept his wrath forever.
- Jonah 3:9 Who knows? God may turn and relent and turn from his fierce **anger**, so that we may not perish.”
- Jonah 4:1 But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he was **angry**.
- Jonah 4:2 And he prayed to the Lord and said, “O Lord, is not this what I said when I was yet in my country? That is why I made haste to flee to Tarshish; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to **anger** and abounding in steadfast love, and relenting from disaster.
- Jonah 4:4 And the Lord said, “Do you do well to be **angry**?”
- Jonah 4:9 But God said to Jonah, “Do you do well to be **angry** for the plant?” And he said, “Yes, I do well to be **angry, angry** enough to die.”
- Micah 5:15 And in **anger** and wrath I will execute vengeance on the nations that did not obey.
- Micah 7:18 Who is a God like you, pardoning iniquity and passing over transgression for the remnant of his inheritance? He does not retain his **anger** forever, because he delights in steadfast love.
- Nah 1:3 The Lord is slow to **anger** and great in power, and the Lord will by no means clear the guilty. His way is in whirlwind and storm, and the clouds are the dust of his feet.
- Nah 1:6 Who can stand before his indignation? Who can endure the heat of his **anger**? His wrath is poured out like fire, and the rocks are broken into pieces by him.
- Hab 3:8 Was your wrath against the rivers, O Lord? Was your **anger** against the rivers, or your indignation against the sea, when you rode on your horses, on your chariot of salvation?
- Hab 3:12 You marched through the earth in fury; you threshed the nations in **anger**.
- Zeph 2:2 before the decree takes effect —before the day passes away like chaff— before there comes upon you the burning **anger** of the Lord, before there comes upon you the day of the **anger** of the Lord.
- Zeph 2:3 Seek the Lord, all you humble of the land, who do his just commands; seek righteousness; seek humility; perhaps you may be hidden on the day of the **anger** of the Lord.
- Zeph 3:8 “Therefore wait for me,” declares the Lord, “for the day when I rise up to seize the prey. For my decision is to gather nations, to assemble kingdoms, to pour out upon them my indignation, all my burning **anger**; for in the fire of my jealousy all the earth shall be consumed.

- Zech 1:2 “The Lord was very **angry** with your fathers.
- Zech 1:12 Then the angel of the Lord said, ‘O Lord of hosts, how long will you have no mercy on Jerusalem and the cities of Judah, against which you have been **angry** these seventy years?’
- Zech 1:15 And I am exceedingly **angry** with the nations that are at ease; for while I was **angry** but a little, they furthered the disaster.
- Zech 7:12 They made their hearts diamond-hard lest they should hear the law and the words that the Lord of hosts had sent by his Spirit through the former prophets. Therefore great **anger** came from the Lord of hosts.
- Zech 10:3 “My **anger** is hot against the shepherds, and I will punish the leaders; for the Lord of hosts cares for his flock, the house of Judah, and will make them like his majestic steed in battle.
- Mal 1:4 If Edom says, “We are shattered but we will rebuild the ruins,” the Lord of hosts says, “They may build, but I will tear down, and they will be called ‘the wicked country,’ and ‘the people with whom the Lord is **angry** forever.’”
- Matt 5:22 But I say to you that everyone who is **angry** with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, ‘You fool!’ will be liable to the hell of fire.
- Matt 18:34 And in **anger** his master delivered him to the jailers, until he should pay all his debt.
- Matt 22:7 The king was **angry**, and he sent his troops and destroyed those murderers and burned their city.
- Mark 3:5 And he looked around at them with **anger**, grieved at their hardness of heart, and said to the man, “Stretch out your hand.” He stretched it out, and his hand was restored.
- Luke 14:21 So the servant came and reported these things to his master. Then the master of the house became **angry** and said to his servant, ‘Go out quickly to the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in the poor and crippled and blind and lame.’
- Luke 15:28 But he was **angry** and refused to go in. His father came out and entreated him,
- John 7:23 If on the Sabbath a man receives circumcision, so that the law of Moses may not be broken, are you **angry** with me because on the Sabbath I made a man’s whole body well?
- Acts 12:20 Now Herod was **angry** with the people of Tyre and Sidon, and they came to him with one accord, and having persuaded Blastus, the king’s chamberlain, they asked for peace, because their country depended on the king’s country for food.

- Rom 10:19 But I ask, did Israel not understand? First Moses says, “I will make you jealous of those who are not a nation; with a foolish nation I will make you **angry**.”
- 2 Cor 12:20 For I fear that perhaps when I come I may find you not as I wish, and that you may find me not as you wish—that perhaps there may be quarreling, jealousy, **anger**, hostility, slander, gossip, conceit, and disorder.
- Gal 5:20 idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of **anger**, rivalries, dissensions, divisions,
- Eph 4:26 Be **angry** and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your **anger**,
- Eph 4:31 Let all bitterness and wrath and **anger** and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice.
- Eph 6:4 Fathers, do not provoke your children to **anger**, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.
- Col 3:8 But now you must put them all away: **anger**, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth.
- 1 Tim 2:8 I desire then that in every place the men should pray, lifting holy hands without **anger** or quarreling;
- Heb 11:27 By faith he left Egypt, not being afraid of the **anger** of the king, for he endured as seeing him who is invisible.
- James 1:19 Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to **anger**;
- James 1:20 for the **anger** of man does not produce the righteousness of God.
- Rev 14:10 he also will drink the wine of God’s wrath, poured full strength into the cup of his **anger**, and he will be tormented with fire and sulfur in the presence of the holy angels and in the presence of the Lamb.
